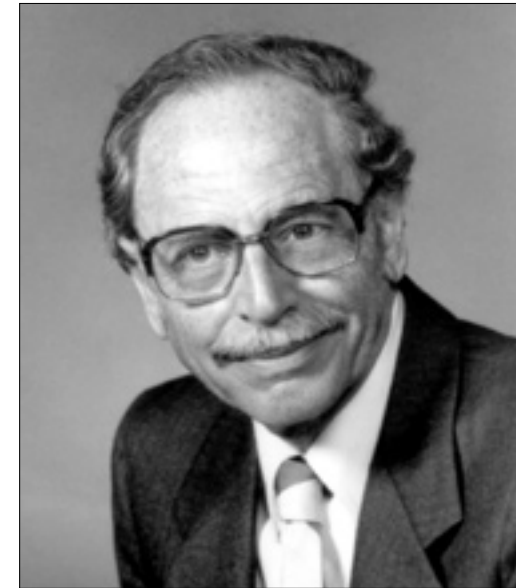

Dr. Irwin Mandel: His Legacy in Oral Health Care

Introduction

This special symposium has been organized by former students of Dr. Irwin Mandel and the Columbia University School of Dental and Oral Surgery (SDOS) to celebrate his influence on generations of dental students, dental practitioners and dental researchers. Dr. Mandel has dedicated his professional life to dental research, teaching and SDOS. He has been a beacon in the dental research community here and abroad, and his research laboratory attracted many junior faculty members and dental students. The Mandel laboratory was a place where science and the future of dental research was discussed, and good science was produced. On the occasion of Dr. Mandel's 80th birthday, Columbia University's 250th anniversary, and Columbia University Medical Center's 75th anniversary, it is fitting to pay tribute to Dr. Mandel for his lifelong devotion to dental research and the dental profession.

Dr. Irwin D. Mandel

Dr. Mandel graduated from the College of the City of New York in 1942 and Columbia University School of Dental and Oral Surgery in 1945. He practiced dentistry part time for more than twenty years. He served as the director of the Division of Preventive Dentistry at SDOS, the founding director of the Center for Clinical Research in Dentistry, and Associate Dean for Research, prior to be appointed Professor Emeritus of Dentistry in 1992. A past president of the American Association for Dental Research, his many awards include the first Gold Medal Award for Excellence in Dental Research from the American Dental Association (1985), the Award for Leadership in Periodontology from Tufts University (1971), the International Award from the University of Connecticut (1979), and the Jarvie-Burkhardt International Award given by the New York State Dental Association (1990). Dr. Mandel received the honorary degree of Doctor of Science from Columbia University in 1996. He also holds honorary degrees from the University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey (1981) and the University of Göteborg, Sweden (1994).

Author of over 250 scientific publications, Dr. Mandel's research interests have encompassed a number of areas including caries, periodontal disease, preventive dentistry, salivary chemistry and diagnostics, and the relations of saliva to oral and systemic disease.

Dr. Mandel is currently a Special Lecturer at SDOS, and serves as a consultant and research mentor on several projects. He is Chief Dental Advisor to Consumers Union and its publications, a position he has held for nearly 50 years. Dr. Mandel is a consultant and spokesperson for the American Dental Association, Associate Editor of the Journal of Dental Research and a grants reviewer for the National Institute of Dental and Craniofacial Research. He has been an active writer and reviewer for the Surgeon General's Report on Oral Health (2000).
